


WHY GEN-Z CONSIDER INTIMACY HIGH-RISK & THE EMERGENCE OF DEFENSIVE INTIMACY

Stimulus	<p>The economic landscape has reframed marriage from a "Financial Asset" (shared growth) to a potential "Liability" (shared debt and housing costs). For a generation faced with slowing growth, coupling is no longer a safety net- it is a financial risk.</p>	<p>As mostly single-children, Gen-Z bear the future weight of the "4-2-1 structure" (supporting two parents and four grandparents). For them, the prospect of coupling means immediately doubling that dependent load, making marriage a high-stakes decision that goes far beyond deciding if they like the other person.</p>	<p>As second-wave digital natives fluent in 'swipe, sort, filter,' Gen-Z bring high expectations of efficiency to dating. Having witnessed their parents endure "high-friction relationships," they are actively seeking a "low-drama" path to avoid emotional chaos.</p>
Response	<p>Defensive Autonomy is where Gen-Z prioritize individual stability and financial security over shared struggle. They insulate themselves from the potential downside of a partnership, treating marriage as a luxury to be afforded rather than a foundation to build upon.</p>	<p>Selective Ambition is where they delay commitment and audit partners not just for attraction, but for the ability to share the load. They are searching for a teammate who adds resources not risks, ensuring the partnership can survive the pressure of modern life.</p>	<p>The Preview Economy is where the desire for certainty drives strict, upfront vetting. They use high-filter criteria to find a perfect, low-drama partner, hoping to guarantee compatibility and "preview" the relationship outcome before the first date even happens.</p>











While it may not have been the core campaign insight, these “labels” are better identifiers than the first names used in the West. It’s a safe, externalized tool for Gen-Z to **signal their identity** and maybe even **gauge compatibility** with others.



THE WHAT

OVV a professional women's wear brand partnered with actress Sun Li, a **symbol of self-sufficiency** as part of their contemporary female freedom and independence campaign.

THE WHY

The campaign focused on **freedom and independence** and confident elegance, a direct endorsement of prioritizing your own **self-determination and emotional foundation**.
